












Percentage of Expenses Year to Date







ON-SCENE INCIDENT COUNTS - NOVEMBER 2019




MAJOR INCIDENT TYPES – NOVEMBER 2019

Annual drivers training is in full swing. Every member must complete an online portion as well as a road test and a competency course.













VII. PUBLIC COMMENTS

VII. PUBLIC COMMENTS STATUTE

A.R.S. §38-431.01(H) A public body may make an open call to the public during a public meeting, subject to reasonable time, place, and manner restrictions, to all individuals to address the public body on any issue within the jurisdiction of the public body. At the conclusion of an open call to the public, individual members of the public body may respond to criticism made by those who have addressed the public body, may ask staff to review a matter, or may ask that a matter be put on a future agenda. However, members of the public body shall not discuss or take legal action on matters raised during an open call to the public unless the matters are properly noticed for discussion and legal action.
